



UA continues to roll; Thomas Worthington next

** The winless Cardinals will try and slay the 3-0 Golden Bears.*

Just about every football season, Thomas Worthington hopes to re-create the biblical story of David and Goliath when it takes on Upper Arlington.

In the high school football version of the biblical tale, however, David's sling shot misfires and Goliath stomps him into the dust just about every year.

Since 1926, the Golden Bears have won 42 of the 52 meetings against the Cardinals.

No Cards team has beaten UA since Worthington Kilbourne opened its doors in 1991.

Despite Thomas Worthington's 14-56 overall record since 2000, the Cards have given the Bears a scare several times since the turn of the century.

A year after Arlington captured the Division I state championship, the '01 squad had to hold on to beat Thomas 20-17.

In '04, the Cards led 20-7 after three quarters, but the Bears rallied to pull out a 27-20 victory.

Last year it took UA two overtimes to win 20-17.

The Bears travel north on state Route 315 to play the Cardinals at 7:30 p.m. Friday, Sept. 14.

UA is 3-0 after pounding visiting Findlay 42-7 Friday, Sept. 7.

Tommy Farwick, Alex Drake and Isaac Wildermuth all rushed for over 100 yards against the Trojans.

Under new coach Scott Gordon, Thomas is 0-3 after getting drubbed 33-21 at Newark in Week 3. The Cards scored all their points in the fourth quarter after the Wildcats had built a 33-0 lead.

Will David's sling shot finally find its mark, or will it be another story of Goliath scraping the little guy off the bottom of his sandals.
